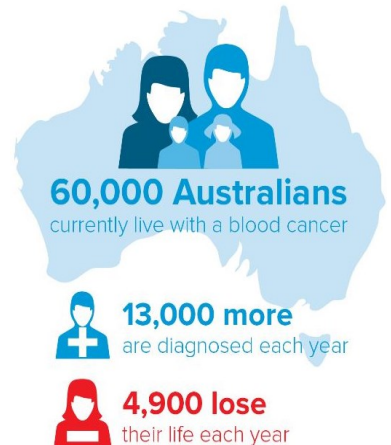

- Blood cancer is the third biggest cause of cancer death across Australia, claiming more lives each year than breast cancer or skin cancer.
- While more children are surviving, almost half of adult blood cancer patients will lose their life.
- Blood cancer accounts for around 10% of all cancers diagnosed each year. Around 35 Australians are diagnosed each day with a [blood cancer](#) – such as [leukaemia](#), [lymphoma](#) or [myeloma](#) – and the number is growing. [Lymphoma](#) is the most commonly diagnosed blood cancer in Australia, and the sixth most common form of cancer.



What do we do?

The Leukaemia Foundation is the only national charity dedicated to helping more Australians with leukaemia, lymphoma, myeloma and related disorders survive their blood cancer and live a better quality of life. We do this by providing a range of free support services for patients to give them the best chance of survival and improve their quality of life, as well as investing in blood cancer research to find improved treatment options.

In 2016/17:

- We invested over \$2.23 million in blood cancer research projects
- We provided 727 families with nearly 54,000 nights of [free accommodation](#) in our villages and motels located near treatment centres
- Our [free patient transport](#) vehicles travelled more than 1,555,000 km across 38,492 trips, transporting passengers to hospitals and other appointments
